Britain yesterday expressed concern at China's imposition of martial law and urged the Government and demonstrators to exercise "restraint and moderation." The Netherlands canceled a visit to China by Queen Beatrix planned for May 24 to 30. Critics of the visit had said the trip would be seen as a token of support for China's rulers.
